Yes. The Undergraduate Music Minor proposal (key 747) is somewhat related to the Undergraduate Minor in Musical Theatre proposal (key 490). Not related to other programs.

Program Justification

Provide a brief description of what changes are being made to the program.

This course revision to the Music Minor includes the elimination of one required music theory course. The current requirement of MUS 101 & MUS 102 (Music Theory and Practice I and II, 2 cr each) or MUS 103 & MUS 104 (Rudiments of Music Theory I and II, 3 cr each), will change to MUS 101 or MUS 102 or MUS 103), resulting in a reduction of minimum total hours from 21 to 18.

Footnotes are removed with details moved into the degree table, along with minimal language changes to Upper Division requirements and Electives.
