The change is to include an alternative option to the EIL 456 requirement since 456 is not currently offered due to the retirement of a professor. We want to still keep 456 as 'one' of the options as we hope to offer again in the future. This change also removes EIL 487: Topics in Second Language Studies from the Introduction to Linguistics options as that section under that rubric is no longer offered. LING 400 is also being removed as an option for the minor as Ling 400 is aimed at graduate students or advanced undergrads and is not an appropriate course for those in the minor.
