Why are these changes necessary?

This is an existing minor. The change is to include a new option rather than EIL 456, which we are currently unable to offer due to a retirement. Also, this change puts the credit hours in line with those required for the State of Illinois endorsement.

1. In order to correct issue with the previous version of the minor in which EIL 214 or EIL 215 were listed as 2 credits each. Changing it to 3 each, puts these courses in line with others for the minor. Each of those courses is 3 hours, not 2 hours.

2. The addition of LING 450 is for two reasons. First, EIL 456 is not currently being offered (but may be again in the future). Second, LING 450 satisfies the same Cross-Cultural Studies requirement for the State of Illinois ESL endorsement. CI 446, Culture in the Classroom will be an option as it also fulfills the State endorsement in this area.

3. By lettings students choose between either EIL 422 or EIL 488, the revision will put the minor at 21 credits instead of the current 24, which is better in line with both university policy and the Illinois State Endorsement.
