Brief description of the program of study: Please explain how the proposed minor meets the following criteria:

- The minor program of study should require some depth in the subject, but not as extensive as the major. The proposed minor requires 18 to 21 hours of coursework spanning introductory economics and management to advanced courses in food and agribusiness management. The current major concentration of Agribusiness Markets and Management includes additional coursework in economic theory, econometrics, accountancy, and computer applications that is not part of the proposed minor.
- Ordinarily the minor should be: 1) a comprehensive study in a single discipline, or 2) an interdisciplinary study focusing on a single theme. If this minor is an exception, please explain and justify. The proposed minor fits the first description.

Justification: The Department of ACE has a long history of teaching, research, and outreach in agribusiness management, a field that continues to be a leading area of study for those interested in working in the dynamic areas of food and agricultural management. Specialists educated in the field of food and agribusiness are critical because of the global demand for food, fiber, and fuel. This demand must be balanced with stewardship of the natural environment. Currently the concentration in Agribusiness Markets and Management in the Department of ACE is the only UIUC curriculum that focuses on issues of food and agribusiness economics and management. Students interested in food and agribusiness economics and management may be pursuing majors in other fields in ACES or other Colleges. Through a coherent set of courses addressing food, agriculture, agricultural economics, and management of agricultural businesses, the proposed minor enables students to deepen their knowledge of the global food and agribusiness system and associated managerial issues as a complement to studies in a related area.

Budgetary and Staff Implications:

- a. Additional staff and dollars needed. None. All of the proposed courses are currently staffed.
- b. Internal reallocations (e.g. change in class size, teaching loads, student faculty ratio, etc). Some classes may be slightly larger and require additional teaching assistants and larger rooms. No changes in teaching loads are anticipated.

Statement for the Programs of Study Catalog: provide a brief description of the minor that includes a list of the specific courses and hours required.

The Food and Agribusiness Management minor is designed for students to deepen their knowledge of the economics and management of agribusinesses as a complement to studies and practices in their major field. Courses will address food, biofuels, biotechnology, agriculture, the environment, and management within the global agribusiness system. The minor requires ACE 100 (4 hours) or ECON 102 (3 hours), ACE 222 (3 hours), ACE 231 (3 hours). Students will choose at least one course from ACE 210, ACE 251, ACE 306, ACE 345, ACE 360 (3 hours, except ACE 360, 2 hours) and at least two courses from ACE 427, ACE 428, ACE 430, ACE 431, ACE 435, ACE 436, ACE 444 (each 3 hours, except ACE 436, 4 hours). The 300- and 400-level courses may have additional prerequisites not included in requirements for the minor. Students in the Agribusiness Markets and Management concentration in the Department of ACE may not be admitted to the Food and Agribusiness Management minor, but students in other concentrations in ACE may be admitted to the minor. No other restrictions on admission to the minor are anticipated. Courses in the minor cannot be taken Credit/No Credit.
