Title of the revised minor: Revision to the Minor in French

Brief description of the program of study and Justification:

The proposed revised minor in French (20 credit hours) is based on the same foundational courses that we require for the major with a concentration in French Studies (37 credit hours). The minor currently requires 22 hours, but most undergraduate minors required no more than 21 hours. This revision reduces the number of required hours to 20 while also providing students with more choices of elective coursework. The minor allows students either to acquire some expertise in both areas of literature and culture or to focus their course work on one of the two (literature *or* culture) while developing their oral and written proficiency in French.

Budgetary and Staff Implications:

a. Additional staff and dollars needed

We do not anticipate any additional funding or staffing due to the proposed revisions.

b. Internal reallocations (e.g. change in class size, teaching loads, student-faculty ratio, etc.)

No internal reallocations of any sort will be necessary after the implementation of the proposed revision.

c. Effect on course enrollment in other departments and explanations of discussions with representatives of those departments

We do not anticipate any effects on the enrollment in other departments.

The proposed revisions will have no impact on these areas.

Expected enrollment in the minor: We have currently ca. 60 minors in French and expect an increase to up to 100.

Admission to the minor: There will be no restrictions for enrolling into this minor other than the fulfillment of the pre-200 level curriculum in French or its equivalent (language acquisition). There will be no limit to the total number of minors.

Minor advisor: Director of Undergraduate Studies

Certification of successful completion: As with all majors and minors in LAS, the French Minor would be monitored by the student's advisor and records officer.
