# PROPOSAL TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATIONAL POLICY TO MODIFY AN UNDERGRADUATE MINOR

Minor in Arabic Studies

#### Brief description of the program of study

The proposal is to revise the list of courses which count toward the minor. The broad-scale structure of the minor is unaffected; there are no proposed changes to the existing general categories that are already established. The minor is interdisciplinary in nature and includes required courses in Arabic language and culture, with options to include courses in Arabic history, politics and religion.

#### Justification:

We are proposing to revise the list of courses that count toward the minor. We are adding the following courses to the list of Interdisciplinary courses students can choose from:

ARAB 413- Arabic-English Translation

HIST 334- Modern Palestinian History

HIST 335- Middle East 1566-1914

CWL 205- Islam & West Through Lit

CWL 481- Topics in Arabic Literature & Culture

We are removing LING/ARAB 411 as a requirement because the course has not been taught. Students will be able to fulfill the Arabic Culture and Linguistic requirement by choosing two of the following:

ARAB 150, ARAB 210, ARAB 412, or a Study abroad equivalent.

The revised minor will be more flexible and allow students to take current courses.

#### **Budgetary and Staff Implications**

The proposal to revise the minor would not impact or require new budgeting or the addition of instructors. The revised minor will be more appealing to students and thus we anticipate a modest increase of the number of students who are interested in pursuing our minor. We anticipate an increase of just a few students per year, which won't require an increase in the number of our teaching staff.

#### **Prerequisites for the minor**

There are no proposed changes to the prerequisites that are already established for the current minor. These are completing ARAB 404 or placing in the Advanced level for those who come with prior experience in Arabic.

#### Expected enrollment in the minor

Proposed revision will be more appealing to students and thus we expect a modest increase in the number of students who are interested in pursuing the minor.

#### Admission to the minor

The proposed revision won't affect the process that the students typically follow in order to get approval from the department to pursue the minor. Students need to fill out a form that consists of fill-in-the-blanks for contact information, the student's major, and UIN; and seek the signature of the advisor for the minor. There is no issue in our current language classes to handle all the students who are pursuing the minor. All are accommodated.

#### **Minor advisor**

The Director for the Arabic Language Program advises students enrolled in the minor through email and one-on-one meetings. In addition, the Arabic Language Program website has information about the minor requirements.

#### Certification of successful completion

Successful completion of the minor is confirmed through the student's Degree Audit Report System (DARS).
