



Proposal to the Senate Educational Policy Committee

PROPOSAL TITLE: Revision of the BSLAS in Psychology- Addition of new concentrations and revision of existing concentrations

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BRIEF DESCRIPTION: This proposal will establish two additional concentrations in the Psychology major. One is a Cognitive Neuroscience concentration, which reflects a major group of faculty within the department but whose research interests and methods are distinct from the faculty supporting the current Behavioral Neuroscience concentration. The other is a Diversity Science concentration, which covers the area of psychological research focusing on prejudice and discrimination and has courses offered by faculty in several areas of psychology. The proposal also separates the Social-Personality Psychology concentration into a Personality Psychology concentration and a Social Psychology concentration. The name of the “General Psychology Concentration” will be changed to “Intradisciplinary Psychology Concentration.” Revisions are requested in the Organizational Psychology concentration. Finally, as new courses were created in our department (PSYC 207, 328, 365, 417) we request to add them to the lists of courses students can choose from within our concentrations.

JUSTIFICATION: Concentrations within the Psychology major were created to recognize students that follow an academic path for their major within one particular area of Psychology. The Psychology Department has always been divided into different program areas, such as cognitive, social, or developmental psychology, based on faculty research interests. While these program areas share some common foundations, they are also specialized in terms of methodologies, scientific questions and intellectual traditions. The original concentrations focused on many of these areas, but omitted a few others for a variety of reasons. One area that was omitted was that of cognitive neuroscience, which investigates how and where higher level cognitive abilities are processed in the brain. This area of psychological research uses a variety of investigative methods, but primarily relies on functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI). The absence of a research methods course prevented the inclusion of cognitive neuroscience in the original proposal for concentrations. That course has now been created (PSYC 445 Cognitive Neuroscience Lab). This proposal will create a Cognitive Neuroscience concentration following the template for the other concentrations within the major: an introductory course, a statistics course, a set of foundation courses, a core or gateway course for the concentration, a

research methods course, and a set of elective courses offered or approved by the members of the cognitive neuroscience program area.

This proposal also creates a Diversity Science concentration. While diversity is an important goal for the Psychology Department and the university, it is also an area of social psychology research that is rapidly expanding. The addition of two new faculty with research interests in diversity has led to the creation of the necessary 200-level core concentration course (PSYC 207 “Psychology of Prejudice and Discrimination”, for which the course proposal form has been submitted). Again, using the concentration template, the Diversity Science concentration requires an introductory course, statistics course, foundation courses and the core course. The research methods course for this concentration will be one of the two standard social psychology methods courses (PSYC 332 or PSYC 333) or the Clinical Lab (PSYC 379). Elective courses are currently available from several different program areas in psychology, examine different aspects of diversity and have been approved for the concentration by the members of the Psychology Department diversity committee. In the future, we plan to work with other departments on campus (e.g. Asian American Studies, African American Studies, Gender and Women’s Studies, Latina/Latino Studies) and cross-list specific courses to serve as electives for this concentration.

Next, the current version of the Social-Personality concentration inadvertently omitted PSYC 250 (Personality Psychology) as a core class. Revising the concentration to include an additional core class would make the concentration overly complicated with two possible core courses and three research methods choices. That structure would be difficult for students to understand. It is simpler to separate the concentration into a Social Psychology concentration and a Personality Psychology concentration. Both concentrations have the same introductory, statistics and foundation course requirements. The Social Psychology concentration has PSYC 201 (Intro to Social Psychology) as the core class and either PSYC 332 (Social Psych Methods Lab) or PSYC 333 (Social Psych in Society Lab) as the research methods course. The Personality Psychology concentration has PSYC 250 (Psych of Personality) as the core class and PSYC 350 (Personality Psych Lab) as the research methods course. Each concentration has electives appropriate to that area of specialization and approved by the faculty in that program area.

A change in the name of the “General Psychology” concentration” to the “Intradisciplinary Psychology” concentration is proposed for two reasons. The primary one is that with the introduction of concentrations, undergraduate psychology majors have been planning their course of study more deliberately. Many students have found that they want to combine courses from two areas such as clinical and developmental psychology, but the students have argued that the current “General Psychology” label does not reflect the intentionality of their intradisciplinary course selections. The second reason is the label “General Psychology concentration” appears to be an oxymoron. With the change to “Intradisciplinary Psychology” concentration, this concentration becomes a destination for students planning their course work and, rather than being catch-all designation, the title encourages intentionality in the planning of an academic career across different program areas in psychology.

A revision is requested for the Organizational Psychology concentration to make PSYC 245 Industrial Organizational Psychology required, because undergraduates need this course in order to be successful in the elective courses offered by the faculty in the organizational psychology program area. Students that have attempted the elective courses (PSYC 455 and PSYC 475) without taking PSYC 245 have been remarkably unsuccessful. With this revision, the Organization Psychology concentration keeps the same total hours (36).

Undergraduate Program

The Psychology program of study is a broad-based curriculum within a research-focused department. The program is designed both for students interested in a liberal arts education with psychology as a focal area and for students who plan to attend graduate or professional school either in psychology or in a different field such as medicine, law, social work, business administration, counseling, labor relations and many others.

The Psychology major provides both depth and breadth of knowledge in Psychology. The major consists of an introductory course, a statistics course, a breadth of knowledge or foundation in the different areas of psychology that comes from a set of core courses, a research methods course, and elective courses that give students a depth of knowledge. Each concentration, except for intradisciplinary psychology, has a core course specific to that area of psychology with a research methods course designed for that concentration. In formulating their Plan of Study, students can decide either to undertake a concentration in **Intradisciplinary** Psychology and select courses that focus on their own unique interests or to specialize in a particular area of Psychology by fulfilling the requirements for one of the other Concentrations listed below.

Undergraduate students also have the opportunity to participate in current research projects by working in labs. Students should contact our Undergraduate Advising Office for help in creating a plan of study that best meets their goals and interests.

The graduate preparatory work in psychology is designed to provide students with a solid academic background that will prepare them for graduate education in a number of psychology specializations. Career opportunities in these specializations vary, as does the required level of graduate school training.

Department Distinction: To be eligible for graduation with Distinction in Psychology, a student must complete a two-semester research sequence in PSYC 494, submit a Senior Thesis, and maintain an overall 3.0 GPA at the time of submission. To be eligible for High or Highest Distinction, a student must first be admitted to the Honors Program, then complete the three semester Honors Program (PSYC 398, PSYC 498, PSYC 499), submit a Senior Thesis, and maintain an overall GPA of at least a 3.0 to be awarded High Distinction or an overall 3.5 GPA for Highest Distinction. 
