Of the 21 required hours, two courses (6 hours) must be 200-level courses approved for advanced hours or 300-level courses.

No more then 6 hours (two courses) may be at the 100- level

A minimum grade point average of 2.75 is required for completion of the minor.

The 24 hours selected by students for a minor in Jewish Culture and Society should form a coherent program and must be approved by the adviser of the Program for the Study of Religion or the chair of the **Program in Jewish Culture and Society**, acting as deputy.
