PROPOSAL TITLE: Revisions to the curriculum of the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: This proposal is made to change the following items in the Department of Theatre curriculum:

- Revise the core requirements for all theatre majors by eliminating three courses and adding five new courses. Two courses are revised with a change in credit.
 With these changes, core requirements are reduced by three credits.
- Rename the internal group designation 'Division of Design' to 'Level 21; Design, Technology and Management'. The internal name 'Level 21' refers to the sum total of the 6 floors in Krannert Center for the Performing Arts and the incorporation of activity on each. Faculty in the Department of Theatre and professionals working at KCPA integrate to deliver design, technology, and management curriculum straddling the academy and the profession.
- Rename the transcripted Lighting Design concentration as Lighting, Design and Technology concentration
- Revise requirements in the following transcripted concentrations:
 - Lighting Design (and Technology)
 - Scenic Technology
 - Sound Design and Technology
 - Stage Management
- Correct and update the General Education requirements tables in the catalogue and credit count for the degree.

JUSTIFICATION:

Changes in the profession, the discipline and the culture demand a reconsideration of how we organize the common core courses for current and future students. In particular, we want to make clear the conceptual links between our core curriculum and our department's mission of *Radical Inclusion*.

The new core curriculum supports collaboration and cohort-building mindful of a broader and more global context. Core classes explicitly include material from a wide variety of historical periods, performance genres, geographic regions, personal perspectives, and social ideologies. Preparing students for further work in their areas of specialization as well as meaningful lives as global citizens in a technologized world, the core curriculum is an articulation of what we believe, what we teach and why we teach it.

By re-thinking foundational courses across the discipline, the department is responding to student desire to move into their areas of specialization earlier. By reducing the number of credit hours in the core, students have more freedom to take more electives, either internal and external. The re-sequencing of courses through all four years—culminating with the capstone course—allows students to build cohorts and communities of practice. The focus on *Radical Inclusion* prepares students for work in a politically charged artistic environment.

Lastly, the internal designation of 'Division of Design, Technology and Management', grouping six of the eight Theatre concentrations, wishes to change its name to *Level 21: Design, Technology and Management*.

Acting Concentration

The acting concentration provides intensive training in a wide variety of performing media.

In the first and second years, students take introductory courses in movement, voice, and acting.

in the Acting Concentration, students in their second year of study must audition for acceptance into the studio in acting. In addition to successful completion of all classes in their first and second years, acceptance will be based on an evaluation of each student's potential for professional-caliber performance, commitment to theatre, and the necessary discipline for intensive study.

Third- and fourth-year students meet in daily four-hour sessions, each of which includes sections in dynamics, voice and speech, movement, and acting. Semester-long acting sections include advanced scene study, musical theatre, Shakespeare, and acting for the camera. Students in the professional studio in acting must audition for department productions and perform as cast.

Theatre Studies Concentration

The theatre studies concentration focuses on the practical application of theatre scholarship and explores theatrical production as a collaborative art form that is grounded in theory, criticism, history, research, and writing.

The theatre studies concentration is intended to lay the foundation for students planning to pursue professional careers in areas of theatre for which advanced training or specialization at the graduate level is normally required. These areas include, but are not limited to: directing, dramaturgy, playwriting, arts management, social issues theatre, and theatre history and criticism.

Emphasis is given to a comprehensive study of theatre practices of the past, material participation in theatre practices of the present, and the discovery and application of theatre practices for the future.

Level 21: Design, Technology and Management Concentrations:

The internal name 'Level 21' refers to the sum total of the 6 floors in Krannert Center for the Performing Arts and the incorporation of activity on each. Faculty in the Department of Theatre and professionals working at KCPA integrate to deliver design, technology, and management curriculum straddling the academy and the profession.

Level 21 groups six distinct but related concentrations. Students planning careers in costume design and construction, lighting design and technology, scenic design, scenic technology, sound design and technology, and stage management are selected for these concentrations by a process of faculty evaluation at the end of their first year of study in the Department of Theatre.

Criteria for acceptance and continuance in these options include satisfactory completion of all course work in the first and second years, potential for professional-caliber work, commitment to theatre, and the necessary discipline for intensive study and practice. Students in these concentrations are assigned to teams that design, mount, and manage more than fifteen productions annually in the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts.
