The BFA Theatre core curriculum is being revised (key 146), along with the 8 current BFA Theatre concentrations (keys 679, 680, 681, 682, 683, 684, 685, 686), a newly proposed concentration (Art & Entertainment Technology-key 950), and the Theatre Studies minor (key 147). An attachment with all changes Enclosed is a previously approved proposal (EP.19.24 approved by Senate on 12/10/2018 for fall 2019) from the major College of Fine and its 9 concentrations are provided comprehensively Applied Arts to revise the BFA in the BFA Theatre program page (key 146). ### Program Description and Justification

Justification for proposal change:

While a previous curriculum change made minor revisions, the opportunity of the full BFA Theatre curricula review to examine and define the objectives and learning outcomes of this concentration allowed for more significant and valuable changes to the Lighting Design and Technology concentration.

Students have a new elective category to select a course of preference rather than a specific requirement.

THEA 153 (3 hours) is added and THEA 453 (3 hours) is eliminated. THEA 153 and 453 share the same course name (Intro to Theatre Sound), but 453 is open to both undergrad and grad students. By requiring 153 instead of 453, it supports a cohort experience for undergraduate students as part of the concentration requirements.

THEA 199 was a temporary course and a permanent course, THEA 119 is newly proposed in the CIM workflow to replace it which adds one additional credit hour. see attached.

and Stage Management. Freshman and sophomore students learn the
