# University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate Monday, November 16, 2020 Zoom Webinar Minutes

### I. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:11 pm with Senate Executive Committee (SEC) Chair Rob Kar presiding and Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as Parliamentarian.

### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

11/16/20-01 Without objection, the minutes of the October 19, 2020 meeting were approved as distributed.

### III. PUBLIC COMMENT

The following undergraduate students requested to speak about the academic climate of the semester: Ananya Cleetus, Kushal Amilineni, Neha Prabhu, Cora McVey, Devin Dionne, Adit Agarwal, Jason Gandrapu, and Michael Garbus.

#### IV. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

Chair Kar noted that several of the items on today's agenda have carried forward from the previous Senate meeting. An email from the Office of the Senate will be sent to faculty senators requesting nominations to fill faculty vacancies on committees.

#### V. CONSENT AGENDA

Hearing no objections, the following items were approved by unanimous consent.

- 11/16/20-02 <u>EP.21.021</u>\* Social Work, BSW -- To Add to The Existing Bachelor of Social Work a Second Degree-Completion Option
- 11/16/20-03 <u>EP.21.022</u>\* BALAS in Linguistics and Teaching English as a Second Language -- Establish in Linguistics and Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL), Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts and Sciences

#### VI. PROPOSALS

11/16/20-04 <u>CC.21.11</u>\* Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the October 19, 2020 Senate Meeting (*Business carried forward from the Oct 19 meeting*)

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), committee member Alam introduced and moved approval of CC.21.11. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

11/16/20-05 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal CC.21.11 was approved with 124 in favor, 1 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

11/16/20-06 CC.21.12\* Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the November 16, 2020 Senate Meeting

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), committee member Alam introduced and moved approval of CC.21.12. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

- 11/16/20-07 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal CC.21.12 was approved with 131 in favor, 1 opposed, and 1 abstention.
- 11/16/20-08 <u>EC.20.06</u>\* Revision to the *Election Rules for the Student Electorate*, Section 5 Conducting Elections

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials (EC), Chair Graber introduced and moved approval of EC.20.06. This proposal would allow the election of student senators to occur later in the semester. Friedman, as a member of EC, added that this proposal will not be implemented until the *Bylaws* are also amended to allow for the change in the voting timeline. The Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (SP) plans to submit the mentioned *Bylaws* amendment for inclusion at the next Senate meeting.

11/16/20-09 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal EC.20.06 was approved with 131 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstentions.

SP Chair Gilmore noted that the Eighth Senate Review Commission recommended each committee review its *Bylaws* and submit any suggested amendments. The next several proposals are those suggested amendments.

11/16/20-10 SP.20.15\* Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part D.4 – Committee on the Budget

On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.20.15 (carried forward from the Oct 19 meeting). No discussion.

- 11/16/20-11 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal SP.20.15 was approved with 125 in favor, 0 opposed, and 4 abstentions. The required two-thirds vote was achieved.
- 11/16/20-12 SP.20.18\* Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part D.7 Conference on Conduct Governance

On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.20.18. One main duty of this body is to review the Student Code. No discussion.

	On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.20.20. This proposal adds mention of specific training that is required of the members. No discussion.

	On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.20.24. This proposal makes it clear that there is an annual and 5-year review process. No discussion.
11/16/20-17	Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal SP.20.24 was approved with 129 in favor, 0 opposed, and 2 abstentions. The required two-thirds vote was achieved.
11/16/20-18	<u>SP.21.01</u> * Revision to the <i>Bylaws,</i> Part D.1.c – Senate Executive Committee (Chair and Vice-Chair eligibility)
	On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.21.01 ( <i>carried forward from the Oct 19 meeting</i> ). Gilmore noted that this proposal adds back the phrase requiring the SEC Chair and Vice Chair be senators that was inadvertently struck by an amendment on the Senate floor. No discussion.
11/16/20-19	Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, proposal SP.21.01 was approved with 131 in favor, 0 opposed, and 1 abstention. The required two-thirds vote was achieved.
11/16/20-20	SP.20.17* Revision to the Bylaws, Part A – Meetings (Presiding at Senate Meetings)
	On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.20.17( <i>carried forward from the Oct 19 meeting</i> ). This proposal changes the person chairing the Senate meetings from the Chancellor to the SEC Chair. No discussion.

#### VII. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

Chancellor Robert Jones congratulated those elected during this contentious election. Jones was proud of the high level of participation from the campus and community. Many of the difficult issues ahead and the divisiveness that was here before the election will continue for some time. At some point this University, as a land grant university, needs to have a critical conversation to address some of these difficult divisive issues and bring everyone together.

There is a continuing issue of intolerance and discrimination that has been persistent in our society remains prevalent in this community. Several Massmails have been sent recently around religious intolerance. We stand against intolerance, hate, and retaliation of all kinds.

We are at a dangerous point in our fight against COVID-19. The number of positive cases has risen high enough in the state to put everyone in mitigation. There were a few increases in the University's 7-day positivity rate that we were able to bring back down by limiting activities to only essential activity. Our responses are data driven. The Chancellor encouraged everyone to limit travel and not to return to campus after Thanksgiving break. If you do return to campus, please return to a regular testing schedule. Please make safe decisions for yourself and those around you.

#### VIII. QUESTIONS

Faculty senator Rosenstock (LAS) noted in response to recent Massmails that for some Jewish individuals, Zionism is not an integral part of their identity and for some it is integral. However, both groups suffer from anti-Semitism. Rosenstock wanted to be sure the Chancellor's advisory council includes students and faculty members from both groups. Jones replied that there are several different views on many issues such as this and a great effort is made to include all those different viewpoints.

Faculty senator Francis (LAS) asked about the possibility of expanding testing to household members of University faculty, staff, and students. Jones stated that we are starting to think about expanding testing outside of the University but need to have the capacity to process additional tests. Cangellaris added that there is also a cost to testing that must be covered. Veterinary Diagnostic Lab capacity is being expanded. The University is working very closely with city and healthcare leaders.

Student senator Fogarty (GRAD) spoke about the recent Massmail regarding Islamophobia and anti-Semitism and her concerns about the university standing with an organization that has beliefs against the message in those recent Massmails. Jones stated that Illinois is supportive of all our students and hope that they feel they can be their authentic selves. We will speak out against hate towards any group. That sometimes means engaging with organizations that not all sides of the conversation agree with.

Senate Minutes 11/16/2020 Page 4 of 6 Student senator Nicholson (ENGR) mentioned the continued mental health struggles of students and asked if the same credit/no credit options that were previously offered would be offered again this semester. Cangellaris replied that the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP) considered a proposal today that addresses some of the student concerns. The SEC has called a meeting to decide possible next actions to address those concerns that students have expressed.

- 11/16/20-22 Faculty senator Dallesasse (ENGR) made a motion to extend the adjournment time from 5:15 pm to 5:30 pm. The motion was seconded with no discussion. The required two-thirds vote was achieved.
- 11/16/20-23 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, the motion to extend adjournment to 5:30 pm was approved with 86 in favor, 14 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

Faculty senator Ngo (LAS), on behalf of the Department of Asian American Studies, requested to be part of the campus conversations on how the University communicates its antiracist and inclusionary policies given the department's expertise in antiracist and transnational studies regarding the US and west Asia. Jones noted that we need to be more strategic about the conversations within our University community and determine educational opportunities surrounding these issues. Jones suggested contacting Sean Garrick, Vice Chancellor for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, to be included in those conversations.

Faculty senator Mathisen (LAS) asked what is being done in response to student concerns about mental health issues during the pandemic. Cangellaris stated that the Counseling Center employees have been working extended hours to try to meet the needs of our students, but it has not been enough in this time of crisis. A task force is being put together to discuss ways we can expand what the Counseling Center, McKinley, and DRES (Disability Resources & Educational Services) has to offer. Cangellaris also stressed the importance of compassion from everyone.

Student senator Kelo (FAA) advocated for a credit/no credit option with an extended deadline for this semester. Jones and Cangellaris reminded senators of the proposal that EP considered earlier today, and that SEC will be meeting about to decide steps forward.

Goals of this Task Force were to develop a new system that would provide more useful information in evaluating teaching, minimize bias in the process, reduce administrative burden, and promote a culture of ongoing improvement in teaching. There will still be student feedback. Student feedback will look different and will be paired with peer evaluations and self-reflection, along with guided wholistic reviews for important decisions like promotion and tenure.

CO.21.01 Resolution in Support of the Illinois Climate Action Plan

#### BACKGROUND

The pioneering efforts of University of Illinois alumnus Charles David Keeling in the late 1950s and early 1960s led to the realization that the concentration of carbon dioxide (CO2) in Earth's atmosphere rises and falls each year as the terrestrial biosphere "breathes," but is steadily rising over time. Based on a variety of evidence, it is now clear that this overall rise is primarily due to the burning of fossil fuels. The amplification of the greenhouse effect by rising CO2 concentrations has been equally clear, resulting in the 16 hottest years recorded since 1880 all occurring from 1998-2015 (NOAA). As CO2 concentrations continue to rise, driven largely by the continuing growth of the world economy, scientists forecast continued warming and climate variability, with long-lasting and potentially irreversible impacts on sea levels, biodiversity, and agriculture.

In 2008, Illinois signed the American College & University Presidents' Climate Commitment, which committed our campus to carbon neutrality—eliminating or offsetting all carbon dioxide emissions—no later than 2050. In 2016, Illinois signed the Resilience Commitment, pledging to build resistance to climate change in our local community. These commitments together are now called the Climate Leadership Commitments. Furthermore, in 2019, President Killeen signed the Climate Emergency Letter, in recognition of "the need for a drastic societal shift to combat the growing threat of climate change" (https://www.sdgaccord.org/climateletter). The Illinois Climate Action Plan (iCAP) (http://sustainability.illinois.edu/campussustainability/icap/) lays out objectives and potential strategies in several key areas, such as energy, transportation, land and water, resilience, and education. The first iCAP was developed in 2010, and approved by Interim Chancellor Easter. The 2015 iCAP was signed by Interim Chancellor Wilson. and endorsed by the Senate in April of 2016 through a Senate resolution. In 2019, the process began for updating the Illinois Climate Action Plan to create iCAP 2020. This was a significant effort that was supported by hundreds of stakeholders across campus, with broad input from the campus community. On October 20, 2020, Chancellor Jones signed and approved the updated plan. We note that the campus has made progress in reducing its emissions and exceeded many of its initial goals set in 2010. It is clear, however, that greater efforts will be needed in order to fulfill the iCAP goals.

As the Senate supported iCAP 2015, we believe that the Senate should strongly endorse campus sustainability through passing a resolution in favor of iCAP 2020.

### **Resolution in Support of the Illinois Climate Action Plan**

WHEREAS the broad consensus of the climate science community (including experts at the University of Illinois) is that the increase of carbon dioxide concentration and that of other greenhouse gases is altering Earth's climate, increasing average temperatures, and increasing climate variability, and

WHEREAS this campus signed the Climate Leadership Commitments, which committed our campus to carbon neutrality no later than 2050 and pledged to build resistance to climate change in our local community, and

WHEREAS the University of Illinois System President signed the Climate Emergency Letter, which recognized the need to accelerate efforts to address climate change, and

WHEREAS the Illinois Climate Action Plan established realistic goals for energy conservation that assisted us in reducing our energy use per square foot by over 40% from FY08 to FY20, saving the campus over \$80 million, and

WHEREAS the iCAP 2020 was developed with broad input from students, faculty, staff, administrators, and community members, and

WHEREAS further steps toward carbon neutrality will require campus-wide support of significant new or additional efforts coordinated across the campus community,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the University of Illinois should reduce its carbon footprint as quickly as possible in order to help prevent devastating climate disruption, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the University of Illinois should take a leadership role by demonstrating how large organizations can effectively eliminate their carbon footprint, and how universities can educate their students on sustainable practices and enable them as future leaders, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Senate recommends that the administration make it a top priority to allocate funding and human resources to the full and rapid implementation of the goals of the Illinois Climate Action Plan 2020 while maintaining the tradition of excellence in scholarly activities that define the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign as a world-leading research and teaching institution.

### EC.20.07 Voting Unit Structure for the Student Electorate

### BACKGROUND

The Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials (EC) is charged with annually reviewing the voting unit structure for the student electorate of the Senate. The voting unit structure remains in effect until otherwise determined by EC and approved by the Senate.

The current voting unit structure was last approved by the Senate in February 2016 (SP.16.04). Because several changes have occurred since 2016, EC is proposing a new voting unit structure after consultation with the Campus Student Election Commission (CSEC) and the Illinois Student Government (ISG) Advisor. EC recommends the voting unit structure change from some colleges divided into multiple voting units to every college as a single voting unit with student senators elected from each college at-large.

Student voting units were originally created to represent students by majors/departments similar to the faculty model. However, in a recent poll, ISG student senators were asked if they felt, as senators, they represented their major, their college, or students at-large. The poll results indicated that most students felt they were representing students at-large or students in their college. This supports the proposal for every college to elect student senators at-large rather than by majors grouped into various sub-units of the college.

In 2016, the proposal (SP.16.04) reduced voting units in the College of Fine & Applied Arts from two voting units to voting at-large, Business from three voting units to two, and Engineering from four voting units to three. That proposal discussed challenges in grouping related disciplines into equally sized voting units with disproportionate department enrollment, and the need to continuously analyze the everchanging student enrollment data at the department level to maintain equally-size voting units. The successful move to fewer sub-units within a couple of colleges and the challenges of maintaining smaller voting units is additional support for at-large voting at the college level.

EC, the ISG Advisor, and the CSEC anticipate the proposed change to electing student senators at-large from each college will increase and balance student participation within the colleges and lessen confusion in the voting process.

EC also recommends creating a voting unit for the School of Information Sciences (i-School) now that the i-School is admitting undergraduates, creating a voting unit for the Carle Illinois

College of Medicine, and removal of the voting unit for the UIC College of Medicine because the program is being phased out.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials recommends approval of each college voting as a single voting unit with student senators elected from each college at-large.

The current and proposed voting unit structure for the student electorate is detailed in the Appendix.

### EC.21.03 Apportionment of the Student Electorate

### BACKGROUND

The Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials (EC) is charged with annually reviewing the apportionment of the student electorate of the Senate. The apportionment plan remains in effect until otherwise determined by EC and approved by the Senate. The *Constitution* mandates allocation of student seats as close to fifty (50) as possible. The current allocation of student seats is fifty-five (55). This proposal sets the number at fifty-three (53) to remain consistent with the intent of the *Constitution*.

The current apportionment plan was last approved by the Senate in February 2016 (SP.16.04). Because several changes have occurred since 2016, EC is proposing a revised apportionment plan after consultation with the Campus Student Election Commission (CSEC) and the Illinois Student Government (ISG) Advisor.

No more than nine (9) of the eleven (11) graduate seats have been filled over the last five (5) years. Recent increase in graduate student enrollment suggests allocation of fourteen (14) graduate student seats. However, after consultation with graduate student senators, it is recommended that the number of seats allocated to the Graduate College remain at the current number of eleven (11).

Since 2016, enrollment overall has increased, the Carle Illinois College of Medicine enrolled students in 2018, the UIC College of Medicine is being phased out, the i-School is now admitting undergraduates, and the Illinois Student Senate (ISS) was reorganized under a new constitution as the Illinois Student Government (ISG).

### RECOMMENDATION

The Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials recommends approval of the revised apportionment plan for the student electorate detailed on the following page.

### SP.21.02 Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part C – Elections

### BACKGROUND

The Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials (EC) has proposed and the Senate has approved revisions to the *Election Rules for the Student Electorate*, Section 5 – Conducting Elections (EC.20.06 approved on 11/16/2020), which provide that the election of students to the Senate shall be completed no fewer than three weeks prior to the organizational meeting of the Senate, rather than prior to spring break. The adjusted timeline allows for greater engagement and recruitment of students to serve within the shared governance system.

This proposal resolves the conflict of language that was created in the *Bylaws* with the approval of EC.20.06. The current *Bylaws* state that student elections must be completed no later than the eighth week of classes in the spring semester, which is earlier than the approved language in EC.20.06. This proposal also provides specific details pertaining to the organization serving as the Elections and Credentials Committee for the students and separates it from the faculty Elections and Credentials Committee description.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures recommends the approval of the following revisions to the *Bylaws*. Text to be deleted is struck through and text to be added is <u>underlined</u>. Adoption of amendments to the *Bylaws* requires a two-thirds vote of the Senate.

# EP.21.032 Report of Administrative Approvals through November 16, 2020

Senate committees are authorized to act for and in the name of the Senate on minor matters. Below is a listing of the administrative approvals the Senate Committee on Educational Policy approved at its meeting on November 16, 2020. Additional information for each approval is attached.

## A. Graduate Programs

1) Master of Arts in African Studies – 1) revise the Program of Study entry in the Catalog, which inadvertently was using the "sum hours" function and displaying a total hour credit range of 32-34 hours. The degree requires 34 hours; 2) remove IS 530, Collection Development (2 or 4 hours), and add IS 451, Bibliography of Africa (4 hours); 3) AFST 515, Practicum in African Studies (2 hours) is a recommended but not required course; this is not a change. The corresponding hours for this needs to be updated to accordingly reflect the course as recommended, not required, changing that listing from 2 hours to 0-2 hours; 4) Similarly, AFST 490, Independent Study (4 hours) has always been optional. The corresponding hours for this course needs to be updated to "0-4" to accurately reflect that the course is recommended, not required; 5) The non-thesis requirements have never counted toward the total number of required hours. In the non-thesis option, the listing of 8 hours of thesis credit needs to be replaced with 8 hours of Area Electives. Although change #1 suggests this is a change in total hours, it actually is not, because the degree has always required 34 hours. The change is a clerical/Catalog-functionality one only so the correct number of total hours, 34, will display.
