## I. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:10 pm with Senate Executive Committee (SEC) Chair Rob Kar (LAW) presiding and Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as Parliamentarian. Chair Kar then conducted a test vote of the Poll Everywhere system.

#### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

11/15/21-01 Without objection, the minutes of the October 18, 2021 meeting were approved as distributed by unanimous consent.

#### III. APPROVAL OF FLOOR PRIVILEGES

#### V. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

Chair Kar reviewed the process for making procedural motions and requested senators participate in a test poll in Poll Everywhere to ensure the system is accessible for the rest of the meeting. Any issues with Poll Everywhere should be addressed to the Office of the Senate.

Kar urged senators to complete COVID testing before leaving campus for fall break and testing after returning from fall break. Kar also referenced the Massmail sent on

October 26 regarding COVID-19 recommendations for before and after Fall Break and encouraged everyone to follow the guidance in that email.

On behalf of the Senate Committee on the Library (LB), Kar announced the Town Hall that will be held on November 18, 2021 from 3:00-4:30 pm via Zoom to discuss the Archives and Special Collections Building and the Undergraduate Library Services.

#### VI. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost Andreas Cangellaris gave remarks on behalf of Chancellor Jones. Cangellaris noted the increase in positive COVID cases which began around the Halloween weekend. This is a trend that is being seen across the state. The SHIELD Team has been working with the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District (CUPHD) to monitor the situation. The increase in cases was expected by the SHIELD Team and CUPHD due to the increase in indoor activities along with Halloween and Dad's Weekend. The cases reported have had mild symptoms and have not been serious enough to require hospitalization. The high vaccination rate of the University community along with testing and face covering compliance has helped to limit outbreaks. Most positive cases are tied to shared housing. The targeted testing in areas where there are spikes in cases has been very affective in mitigating the spread.

Cangellaris reported that CUPHD is offering booster vaccinations and are available to those that are 6 months out from their second dose. Vaccinations for 5–12-year-old children are now available by appointment only through CUPHD. It is important to get individuals vaccinated as quickly and as many as possible. Cangellaris reiterated the importance of following the recommendations and requirements for traveling during and returning after fall break. Testing requirements must be followed to retain building access after returning from fall break.

December Commencement events are coming up. Please check the Commencement website, <a href="https://commencement.illinois.edu">https://commencement.illinois.edu</a>, for more information about safety recommendations and requirements for attending commencement activities. Face coverings must be worn indoors. There will be staff enforcing face covering requirements. Disposable masks will be available for those who do not have one. Anyone not wanting to wear a face covering inside can watch a livestream outside. Any students not willing to wear a face covering will not be permitted to participate in the commencement ceremony.

The Annual Celebration of Diversity was organized and held last week by the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. This was the thirty-sixth consecutive celebration which includes honoring recipients of the Larine Y. Cowan Make a Difference Awards. This year one of those recipients was SEC member JJ Pionke. Pionke was awarded in the area of Excellence in Access & Accommodations.

#### VII. QUESTIONS

Faculty senator Mathisen (LAS) expressed concern about the increase in COVID positivity rates and requested consideration of switching teaching modalities for the last couple of weeks of instruction after fall break. Cangellaris indicated that the response to the increase in COVID cases was a robust effort between the SHIELD Team and CUPHD. The targeted testing protocol has shown to be an effective response to outbreaks.

Faculty senator Rosenstock (LAS) noted his continued concern about contract tracing and the increase in positive COVID cases. Rosenstock requested a report that included depersonalized data pertaining to the number of students testing positive who attended classes during their window of infectiousness and the number of close contacts. Cangellaris thanked Rosenstock for his suggestion and noted it will be considered.

Faculty senator Schneider (SIS) inquired about the vaccination rate of faculty and staff and why it is not higher. Cangellaris thanked Schneider for pointing out that there is an ability, by increasing the number of individuals that are vaccinated, to do even better. Those individuals that have exemptions in place and are not vaccinated are required to remain compliant with testing protocols.

Faculty senator Choquette (ENGR) asked about the return of indirect costs recovery (ICR) funds to faculty that were suspended due to COVID. Cangellaris asked that he have time to retrieve the most up-to-date information regarding ICR funds before providing an answer. The information will be forwarded to senators once it has been compiled.

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Chair Sandler introduced and moved approval of proposal CC.22.14. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

On behalf of the Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedure (SP), Chair Gilmore introduced SP.19.15 for a second reading and moved approval of proposal SP.19.15. Gilmore noted that when making recommendations on revisions to the *Statutes*, it is to the Board of Trustees. All three senates must agree on the revisions or be reconciled by the University Senates Conference (USC) and approved by the Board before the proposed revisions would go into effect. A short discussion followed.

- 11/15/21-22 Faculty senator Cromley (EDUC) made a motion to return SP.19.15 to SP for further consideration on determining cases of conflict and to allow for additional feedback to be sent to SP for consideration. The motion was seconded.
- 11/15/21-23 Through the online voting system Poll Everywhere, the motion to return proposal SP.19.15 to SP for further consideration was approved with 96 in favor, 16 opposed, and 11 abstentions.
- 11/15/21-24 SP.20.23\* Proposed Revisions to the Statutes, Article I, Section 5 Chancellors and Vice Presidents, Article II, Section 3a(1) Faculty Role in Governance, and Article III, Section 1 The University.

On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced and moved approval of proposal SP.20.23. Gilmore gave additional information on the history of the development of this proposal.

11/15/21-25 Faculty senator Burbules (EDUC) made a motion to amend SP.20.23 by deleting "or in a manner to be determined by the senate" on line 15 and lines 43-44. The motion was seconded, and discussion followed.

WHEREAS these CDC guidelines state that "an infected person can spread SARS-CoV-2 starting as early as 2 days before they have any symptoms (or for people with no COVID-like symptoms, 2 days before their positive specimen was collected)" and the guidelines define a "close contact" during this 2 day period prior to the onset of symptoms or a positive test collection as someone who "was less than 6 feet away from infected person (laboratory-confirmed or clinical diagnosis) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period"<sup>2</sup>; and

WHEREAS the CDC guidelines further state that close contacts in IHEs include both vaccinated and unvaccinated students, whether protected by a mask or not; and

WHEREAS CDC guidelines require that case investigators tell close contacts to quarantine if they are unvaccinated or to take a test within 5-7 days if they are fully vaccinated; and

WHEREAS the federated data collected from all case investigations of infected students at a particular IHE therefore includes the number of classes in which these infected students were present within the 2 day period prior to their symptoms or their positive test collection, whichever is earlier, and the number of close contacts who were identified in these classes; and

WHEREAS many instructors at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign have concerns about whether and when infectious students have been in their classrooms, causing instructors to be worried that they or their students may have been exposed to an infected student; and

WHEREAS these worries are exacerbated because instructors are not routinely told that an infected student was in their classroom nor are they routinely asked by case investigators for information that may help identify close contacts, so that many instructors are therefore concerned that perhaps not all exposed individuals, including themselves, have been identified by the case investigator if and when they happen to be informed by one of their students that they tested positive for COVID-19 and will need to miss classes; and

WHEREAS these worries are further exacerbated when instructors are immunocompromised or are caretakers of young children or elderly parents or have other legitimate reasons to want to know that their classrooms are safe and, whenever an infectious student may happen to have been present during a class period, that all precautions have been taken to prevent the further spread of the virus in the classroom; and

WHEREAS the concerns of many UIUC instructors are not unlike those of instructors at other universities, or of the instructors at other campuses of the University of Illinois System; and

WHEREAS the University of Illinois Chicago Contact Tracing and Epidemiology Program (CCTEP), for example, follows the same CDC guidelines for IHEs as does our CUPHD, but offers a different model in how they deal with instructor concerns about classroom safety; and

WHEREAS CCTEP informs instructors when a student tests positive for COVID-19 and has been present in the instructor's class during the 2-day window of the disease's infectiousness prior to first symptoms or the positive test collection; and

WHEREAS CCTEP follows the legal requirements of FERPA and HIPAA in de-identifying student personal data when it informs instructors about an infectious student having been present in their classroom<sup>3</sup>; and

WHEREAS the Director of CCTEP informs instructors about the fact of an infectious student having been in the classroom for the following reasons:

"We always will notify the instructor for a few reasons. The first is because we will always inquire about seating documentation so we can better ascertain who was exposed. Additionally, we have found that being transparent helps both students and instructors feel more comfortable. We have often found that notifying classrooms, even when there was not an exposure helps everyone understand that the situation was addressed and that should they have been exposed, they would have been contacted." And

WHEREAS many instructors at UIUC want and deserve the same level of concern and transparency as is shown to instructors by the CCTEP at UIC; and

WHEREAS many of our peer institutions across the country share de-identified data about the safety of instructional spaces with individual instructors and/or with all instructors in a federated and de-identified form on a regular basis, to provide transparency and mitigate the legitimate anxieties of instructors about the safety of their instructional spaces; and

WHEREAS CUPHD is an independent health department and does not answer to the university chain of command in the way that CCTEP does at UIC;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Academic Senate of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign charges the Chair of the Senate Executive Committee to convey in writing to the Administrator of the CUPHD Julie Pryde and to the Deputy Administrator Dr. Awais Vaid that the Senate respectfully requests that they take steps to allay the concerns of many instructors by having case investigators (1) share with instructors the fact that a student was in their classroom during the 2 day window of their infectiousness, de-identifying all PIIs in conformity with FERPA and HIPAA regulations, and (2) use this as an opportunity to solicit from the instructors any information that may be useful in helping to identify close contacts in the classroom of the infected student; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the written communication to the Administrator and Deputy Administrator of CUPHD also request that, whether or not they choose to take the aforementioned steps to allay instructor worries and gather additional data about potential exposures in the classrooms, that the following federated and de-identified data, collected during case investigations of our students, be shared with the Chancellor or someone designated by the Chancellor on a biweekly basis, namely (1) the number of classrooms in which an infectious student (in the 2 day window prior to the onset of symptoms or positive test collection) was present during the prior two weeks and (2) the number of close contacts of such students who were exposed to infectious students in instructional settings, and how many of these contacts tested positive (all data to be de-identified), in order to assure all the members of the university community that our instructional spaces are as safe as possible no matter what fluctuations and spikes may occur during the pandemic, within the limits of the contact tracing procedures recommended by the CDC for IHEs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the written communication to the Administrator and Deputy Administrator of the CUPHD conclude by thanking them and their staff for the valuable work they have been doing during the pandemic in keeping the community safe and assure them that our requests are made with respect and deference to their authority and judgment in this matter, and are in no way meant to be a criticism of the work of the CUPHD to date.

SUR.22.01 Report on SURSMAC\* Meeting, November 4, 2021

The SURSMAC held its Annual Meeting electronically beginning at 10 a.m. on November 4, 2021. Those attending were welcomed by Melanie Lewis, SURSMAC Chair. The agenda included updates from members of the SURS administration and the Annual Meeting of SURSMAC. (NOTE: Copies of the PowerPoint or web page material for the four "Meeting Presentations" from the SURS staff that are summarized below are available at the SURSMAC link on the SURS home page: https://surs.org/sursmac/).

The first speaker was Interim Executive Director and Chief Benefits Officer Suzanne Mayer. She noted that since our last meeting Larry Curtis, who had served as the long-time liaison with SURSMAC, had retired and that Kristen Houch, Director of Legislative and Stakeholder Relations, was serving as the current liaison. She summarized the SURS financial status (e.g., the funding ratio is 43.8%, a slight rise from the 42.2% in 2020); noted the results of the 2021 Board of Directors Election; and went over the SURS Defined Contribution Plans. She described the changes in effect for working with annuitants due to the pandemic since in-person visits were not possible. She concluded by discussing the changes that had been made in designing the new SURS website including insuring that it was ADA compliant.

The point she made that is probably of most interest to current employees near retirement is that the Money Purchase Factor will change effective July 2, 2022. Those affected are individuals who first became participants before July 1, 2005 for whom the Money Purchase calculation will provide the higher retirement annuity. For them, the change will result in an estimated 2% to 4% reduction in monthly benefit payment if they retire on or after July 2, 2022. She noted that anyone who feels they might be affected should be sure to be aware of their options. For more information, you can visit the SURS website (https://surs.org/money-purchase-factor-change/).

The second speaker was Chief Investment Officer Doug Wesley who provided an investment update. He began by summarizing the allocation of funds in the investment portfolio compared to the target allocation and how the approved targets had changed under the new policy allocation approved in June 2021. As of June 30, 2021, the SURS portfolio performance was slightly below the market goal for the one year (23.8% vs. 24.4%) and three year (10.4% vs. 10.7%) periods. He concluded by discussing the key partners with whom SURS works and the other activities the Investment Department had undertaken.

The third speaker was Albert Lee, Associate General Counsel. He discussed the rulemaking process under the Illinois Administrative Code and the rules governing the State Universities Retirement System. The rulemaking process is overseen by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). The rules promulgated by SURS have more than 60 sections under Title 80, Part 1600 of the Illinois Administrative Code. Currently, SURS is in the process of promulgating rules that define who is an "employee" for SURS participation purposes. The First Notice version of these proposed rules was published at 45 Illinois Register 8638, July 16, 2021. He discussed that the proposed rule is being moved to Second Notice for review by JCAR and will propose a 10% minimum FTE standard for continuous employment and a delayed effective date of January 1, 2023.

The final speaker was Kristen Houch, Director of Legislative and Stakeholder Relations who discussed the bills that had been passed by the Legislature this year that related to retirement matters.

Chair Lewis thanked the speakers for their presentations and called the SURSMAC Annual Meeting to order. She discussed the changes that had occurred that were mentioned by Ms. Mayer and her plans for the next year. This was followed by the election of the following officers: Chair: Melanie Lewis; Vice Chair: Linda Brookhart and of the following members of the Executive Committee: Mary Nippe and Judy Connelly. She also discussed the plans for choosing members of the Legislative and Benefits Committees. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at about 11:20 a.m.
