Why are these changes necessary?

Organizational changes more clearly define the MLA paths as Post-Professional (for students with a BLA) and Pre-Professional (for students without a BLA), each of which offer a Thesis track or Advanced Studio option.

1. LA 501 was revised from a 2 to a 4 credit hour course in June 2021, but the change is not auto-populating in the degree table.
2. LA 438 was revised from 3-6 hours to 5 hours in November 2020, but the change is not auto-populating in the degree table.
3. The non-thesis option was originally named 'specialization option' and is renamed to be 'advanced studio option'
5. Added header for thesis option
6. Clarifying additional prerequisite courses that may be required for those entering without a BLA in pre-prof track.
7. Removing required internship, not required for accreditation.
8. Clarifying 'coursework' by adding advisor approval required
9. Clarifying Pre- and Post-professional curriculum. The MLA is an LAAB accredited program. As such, we are required to cover specific knowledge and skills in order to maintain accreditation, preparing students for eventual licensure. Post-Professional students include students who have completed an LAAB Accredited BLA degree. Pre-Professional students include students from the following sources:
 - (1) international BLA programs (none of which are LAAB accredited)
 - (2) design-related Bachelor's or Master's degrees from fields other than Landscape Architecture (e.g., Architecture)
 - (3) bachelor's degrees that are not design related

The two most common units outside of LA that students elect to take courses in are NRES in the College of ACES and DURP in the College of FAA. Letters of approval with no specific courses listed are attached (the drop-down courses each list 1 example from each unit), to represent the willingness to allow MLA students in their courses to complete these elective requirements.

YES, Landscape Architecture is a regulated profession in the United States, with U.S. jurisdictions requiring specific education, experience (in professional practice), and examination requirements to qualify for state-based licensure. Continuing education documentation is also required to maintain licensure over the years.

The State of Illinois regulates the practice of landscape architecture through its Title Act statute under the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. The MLA program at the University of Illinois is an LAAB-accredited program through the Landscape Architecture Accreditation Board (LAAB) which satisfies the education requirement under the licensure standard in the State of Illinois.

The Council of Landscape Architecture Registration Boards (CLARB) and the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) Licensure & Government Affairs Committee provide oversight and resources for states, including the State of Illinois, to uphold these licensure standards in keeping with the stated objective/responsibility of the profession to protect life, safety, and welfare of the public and natural resources and systems.

Students with a BLA from an LAAB Accredited program will enter the Post-Professional Program. Students with a BLA from a non-LAAB Accredited program and students with other undergraduate design degrees (such as Architecture) will enter the Pre-Professional Program with advanced standing, with any required courses waived if taken during their undergraduate degree. Students with no prior design background will enter the full 3-year Pre-Professional program.

During the course of the first year, Post-Professional students will determine whether they will either complete a thesis or advanced studios in their second year. During the course of the second year, students in the Pre-Professional program will determine whether they will either complete a thesis or advanced studios in their final year.

Master of Landscape Architecture Thesis Option

The thesis path entails working with a thesis committee under the supervision of a faculty advisor (aka the thesis committee chair) to pursue in-depth, independent work of relevance to landscape architecture and accomplishing one or more of the following goals:

- Demonstrate an innovative application of existing knowledge within the field
- Analyze, critically examine, and/or empirically test ideas/theories
- Creatively synthesize, expand upon, and/or develop designs/theories
