#### Why are these changes necessary?

1. The Art History program would like to revise the (current) name of the BALAS in History of Art in the college Liberal Arts and Sciences. The Art History program faculty want it to be called "Art History" (this has been discussed by program faculty multiple times). The feeling is that the current title "History of Art" is confusing, because the course rubric is ARTH. When degrees are alphabetized in the academic catalog, students see Art & Art History for the BFA, and don't realize that there is a second art history degree option filed under "H." In our opinion, it is better to have them both begin with "Art" so that they are alphabetized together.

2. Inputting new campus gen ed requirement template per office of the provost initiative.

3. ANTH 224 was deactivated and the course no longer exists, so it is removed from the approved list of supporting courses in the Humanities offered by LAS requirement.
