We are requesting to eliminate this concentration; it has never been open for students to apply or pursue.

Why are these changes necessary?

This concentration was proposed in early 2020 as part of an internal discussion to review and potentially phase down the MS Technology Management program (MSTM). The strategy at the time included re-directing students to the MS Management (MSM) program and offering this concentration to individuals who would have otherwise enrolled in the MS Technology program, as at the time the MS Technology program had declining enrollments and the MS Management program was growing rapidly. The concentration proposal was approved quickly (IBHE approved it on 5/21/2020) with an effective date of FA20. However, since we were completing our recruiting and admissions process for AY20, we could not promote this concentration while also enrolling a new cohort of MS Technology Management students; therefore, we suspended it until FA22. In FA22 we requested another suspension through AY22-23 and AY23-24. We requested the continued suspension due to ongoing activities within the college related to the MS Technology program.

- College leadership reviewed our marketing and positioning statements, as well as national market trends, and proposed adjustments to our marketing strategy to boost applicants to MS Technology Management.
- A new academic director for the MS Technology Management Program was named effective FA22.
- A new Associate Dean of Graduate Programs was put in place during summer 2022.
- We reviewed our admissions process and requirements, allowing more applicants to be considered for admission to the MS Technology Management program. We started this new approach in FA22 for recruiting for AY23-24.

The results were dramatic. In FA23 we had the highest enrollment in MS Technology Management since 2016. Therefore, the overarching proposal to phase down the MS Technology Management program was never approved by Gies EPC, and this concentration will not be offered. Since the concentration proposal was submitted and approved prior to the adjustments to college and program leadership, the continued suspensions were requested to allow the review process to be completed. Subsequently, the MS Technology program is viable and will remain a key program within our portfolio of graduate degrees. We do not see any opportunity to offer this concentration moving forward.
