This requirement has not changed in the BA in Music degree, but provides the specified lists in the POS, along with an option for additional courses with advisor approval should any special topics be offered under adv music theory or adv musicology and suitable for a BA music major.. Under "BA in Music Coursework" adding: "(MUS or MUSC 400-level courses, not including ensembles)" next to "Advanced Music Electives." Cleaning up language that has been using "upper-level" and "advanced" for the same level of courses and instead specifying the exact level.
- (3) For consistency, changing the word "Courses" to "Electives" in "Advanced Music Electives."
- (4) This proposal is submitted alongside a new concentration in Music Technology and references to that concentration are embedded in this major proposal
- (5) For accessibility, removing footnotes.
- (6) Reorganizing Music Theory and Musicianship requirements so that the courses are listed in numerical order

normally equates to 48 50 hours excluding the keyboard skills (MUS 172 and MUS 173) requirement, and includes 37 41 hours in music courses, 29 31 hours in corecourses. Students who wish to study voice or an instrument for credit are credit are required to satisfy the instrumental or vocal qualifying audition designed for students outside the School of Music.

Credits earned in applied music lessons are generally considered elective.

A minimum of twelve hours of 400-level courses in Music must be taken on the Urbana-Champaign campus.
