The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (LAS) proposes developing and implementing a Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) degree. This degree aligns with the University's Next 150 Strategic Plan for expanded access to higher education and the LAS 2021-2025 Strategic Plan to create innovative learning experiences.

In 1961, the University of Oklahoma established the first Liberal Studies degree program in the country (Caperton, Melissa (Fall 2011). "Our History: the OU College of Liberal Studies". Vantage Point. 8 (1): 3–9). The degree would meet the needs of nontraditional students wanting to continue their education while balancing work and family obligations. Since then, the BLS degree has become an industry-recognized degree designed specifically to support students requiring a nontraditional approach to degree completion. Unlike a more traditional baccalaureate degree (BA, BS), the BLS offers greater flexibility in completion. The BLS degree is ideal for working adults with responsibilities or those who may have started their academic careers but never completed them. This flexibility allows students to balance their education with their personal and professional lives. Unlike a traditional baccalaureate degree that often requires students to specialize in a single major, the BLS degree emphasizes interdisciplinary learning, equipping students with a broad understanding of various fields. By focusing on practical skills and knowledge, the BLS degree prepares students for success in various careers.

Addressing the Equity Gap in Higher Education

In the U.S., a significant number of college students, particularly Black and Latinx students, begin but do not complete a four-year degree (National Student Clearinghouse Research Center "Some College, No Credential Student Outcomes" 2023). The BLS degree will specifically target this population by offering an accessible and flexible pathway to a bachelor's degree. Access to online courses eliminates geographical barriers and caters to the needs of non-traditional students, such as working adults and caregivers, who manage work and family obligations. The BLS initiative addresses equity gaps in educational attainment and fosters greater opportunities for historically marginalized students.

Programmatic Advantages for Student Success

The BLS degree offers a unique blend of academic exploration and focused learning. Students will explore a diverse range of subjects within the liberal arts and sciences while simultaneously building a solid foundation in core disciplines. Collaborating with dedicated advisors, students select a concentration that aligns with their interests and career goals. Furthermore, the degree is transfer credit friendly as it was designed to account for the significant number of credit hours that transfer students may articulate in, providing flexibility while maintaining a clear pathway to graduation.

Expected Outcomes and Institutional Impact

The implementation of the BLS degree will create multiple positive outcomes. The BLS degree

will prepare graduates for careers and occupations in education, government, non-profit organizations, business, and more. Additionally, graduates may pursue further educational opportunities such as advanced degrees, specialized certifications, or professional programs. The BLS degree will increase access to a four-year degree for underserved student populations, leading to improved completion rates for historically marginalized students. By establishing this innovative degree, the College of LAS is committed to creating transformative learning experiences that bridge equity gaps in higher education and empower students from all backgrounds to achieve their academic goals.
