

**UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS URBANA-CHAMPAIGN SENATE
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2025
ILLINI ROOM A, ILLINI UNION AND ZOOM
MINUTES**

1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:15 pm by Rurik Tywoniw serving as the Presiding Officer of the Senate with Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as Parliamentarian.

2. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

5. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR’S REMARKS

Faculty senator (ACES) and Chair of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), Angela Lyons welcomed senators and thanked them, the Office of the Senate staff, and campus partners for their continued commitment to shared governance. She reminded the body that the Annual Faculty Meeting will be held on December 8, 2025, with a shortened Senate meeting to follow.

Lyons reported that Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs Danita Brown-Young and Vice Chancellor for Chicago Strategic Partnerships Rashid Bashir recently provided annual presentations to the SEC. VC Brown-Young highlighted Student Affairs’ programs and the pressures created by rising enrollments. VC Bashir provided an early overview of the transition of the Discovery Partners Institute (DPI) from the System to the Grainger College of Engineering, noting that thoughtful, strategic planning will be needed throughout the coming year. Additional updates are expected from the President and Chancellor at the December 8, 2025 Annual Faculty Meeting.

Lyons announced that the Ninth Senate Review Commission (SR9) has begun its work and has been encouraged to think creatively and holistically in its review of Senate structures and practices. Lyons thanked Professor Nolan Miller and SR9 members for their service.

Chair Lyons highlighted today’s vote on EP.25.082, Revision to the Language Other Than English (LOTE) Requirement for Online Degree Completion Programs and provided a refresher on *Standing Rule 17* that governs floor privileges and speaking time.

She also provided advance notice of a new interim University of Illinois System policy on Integrity in Research and Scholarly Activities (OT-393), adopted to ensure compliance with federal requirements by January 1, 2026. The University Senates Conference (USC) has forwarded the policy to all three senates and requested feedback by May 1, 2026. SEC has

referred the policy to the Senate Committees on Academic Freedom and Tenure (AF), Research Policy (RP), and General University Policy (GP) for review, with feedback due to SEC by February 23, 2026. Senators will also have an opportunity to submit feedback online, and the interim policy will appear on the December 8, 2025 Senate agenda.

6. PROPOSALS

a) **CC.26.22, Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate and Senate Representatives to Other Bodies at the November 10, 2025 Senate Meeting**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Chair Chaya Sandler presented and moved approval of CC.26.22 to fill current committee vacancies.

Presiding Officer Tywoniw called for nominations from the floor. Faculty senator Stirek (FAA) nominated Theresa Dobbs (LAS) from the floor to serve on the Senate Committee on the Budget (BG). There were no additional nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt CC.26.22 as presented was approved with 157 in favor, 1 opposed, and 4 abstentions.

b) **EP.26.059, Establish the Bachelor of Arts in Fine and Applied Arts in the College of Fine and Applied Arts**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP), Chair Nolan Miller introduced and moved approval of EP.26.059. Chair Miller noted that this proposal establishes a fully online Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Fine and Applied Arts (FAA) as a degree-completion program for students with prior college credit. Miller noted that while the program is straightforward and expected to enroll about 20 students annually, it was brought to the Senate floor rather than the Consent Agenda because the procedures for evaluating online programs are still being reviewed.

Questions from senators focused on enrollment projections, development of additional online courses, resource needs for converting existing courses to online delivery, the process for selecting courses included on the elective list, and the program's compliance with the current Language Other Than English (LOTE) requirement. The Dean of FAA, Jake Pinholster, addressed concerns regarding faculty support, instructional staffing, and course modality changes, clarifying that listed electives are options rather than requirements. Senators also asked about assessment of similar programs elsewhere and how student

outcomes will be tracked; the college will use existing alumni-tracking tools such as the Strategic National Arts Alumni Project (SNAAP).

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt EP.26.059 was approved with 147 in favor, 4 opposed, and 13 abstentions.

c) EP.25.082, Revision to the Language Other Than English (LOTE) Requirement for Online Degree Completion Programs

On behalf of EP, Chair Nolan Miller presented EP.25.082 for a second reading and moved approval of EP.25.082. The proposal reduces the LOTE requirement for undergraduate online degree completion programs from three semesters to two. EP described the change as a compromise intended to increase access for adult, part-time, and returning students while maintaining existing standards for residential programs. Chair Miller noted that letters from French & Italian faculty, Spanish & Portuguese faculty, and the School of Literatures, Cultures, and Linguistics administration were included online.

The Senate engaged in a robust discussion. Extensive comments were offered both in support and in opposition. Supporters emphasized access, flexibility for working adults, alignment with peer online programs, and the need to reduce barriers for Illinois residents with some college but no degree. Opponents argued that language study is essential to a well-rounded education, that reducing the requirement may disadvantage learners, undermine intercultural competence, reduce language offerings, and set a precedent affecting on-campus programs. Some speakers raised concerns about the definition of “online degree completion program” and potential inequities for existing online programs.

Faculty senator Roseman (LAS) made a motion to close debate. The motion was seconded, and by i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to close debate was approved with 122 in favor, 21 opposed, and 11 abstentions.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt EP.25.082 failed with 59 in favor, 86 opposed, and 15 abstentions.

d) SC.26.05, Election of a Graduate Student Senator to the 2025-2026 Committee on Committees

On behalf of SEC, Chair Angela Lyons introduced and moved approval of SC.26.05. No discussion followed and there were no nominations from the floor. Nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SC.26.05 with 153 in favor, 1 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

e) SC.26.08, Interim Selection of Student Senators to Serve on the 2025-2026 Student Election Board (SEB)

On behalf of SEC, Chair Angela Lyons introduced and moved approval of SC.26.08. The proposal provides an interim mechanism for appointing two student senators, Holt (ACES) and Pence (LAS), to serve on the newly established Student Election Board (SEB). The SEB, created by the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs, assumes responsibilities previously held by the Campus Student Elections Commission (CSEC). The motion also directs the Senate Committee on Elections and Credentials (EC) to review the SEB's proposed role relative to the Senate and recommend, if appropriate, a regular selection process for future student representatives.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SC.26.05 was approved with 149 in favor, 0 opposed, and 8 abstentions.

f) SP.26.03, Proposed Revision to the *Constitution*, Article II, Section 10 and Article V, Sections 1-2, and Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part B.5 (reference to the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Medicine at Urbana-Champaign)

On behalf of the Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (SP), Chair David Dalpiaz introduced and moved approval of SP.26.03. Chair Dalpiaz noted this proposal removes all references to the "University of Illinois at Chicago College of Medicine at Urbana-Champaign" from the Senate *Constitution* and *Bylaws*. The Carle Illinois College of Medicine follows standard Senate procedures and does not require separate mention. Dalpiaz also noted that the *Bylaws* revisions would not take effect the Board of Trustees approves the revision of the *Constitution*.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SP.26.03 was approved with 154 in favor, 0 opposed, and 2 abstentions.

g) SP.25.01, Proposed Revision to the *Statutes*, Article II, Section 3 – Faculty Role in Governance, Article IX, Section 3.c – Appointments, Ranks, and Promotions of the Academic and Administrative Staff, and Article X, Section 1.a(6) – Tenure of Academic Staff

On behalf of SP, Chair David Dalpiaz introduced SP.25.01 for a second reading and moved approval of SP.25.01. Chair Dalpiaz reminded senators that this proposal adds the "principal" modifier to instructor and lecturer ranks throughout the *Statutes*, aligning statutory language with University practice established in Provost's Communication 25. The change creates a parallel reference to the existing rank structure and does not alter any rights or privileges associated with these appointments.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SP.25.01 was approved with 150 in favor, 1 opposed, and 5 abstentions.

h) RS.26.01, Resolution to Reject the Compact on Academic Excellence in Higher Education

On behalf of the RS.26.01 signatories, faculty senator Hale (EDUC) introduced and moved approval of RS.26.01. The resolution urged the Senate to formally reject the recently issued

federal “Compact on Academic Excellence in Higher Education,” emphasizing that its requirements conflict with the University’s mission and values. Senators noted alignment with the Senate’s previously approved RS.25.01, Resolution to Join a Mutual Academic Defense Compact (MADC) for the Universities of the Big Ten Academic Alliance, and highlighted both faculty and student support, including multiple student co-signers.

After a short discussion, faculty senator McDuffee (LAS) made a motion to close debate, and the motion was seconded. By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to close debate was approved with 135 in favor, 1 opposed, and 4 abstentions.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt RS.26.01 was approved with 144 in favor, 3 opposed, and 6 abstentions.

7. PUBLIC COMMENT

No requests received.

8. CHANCELLOR’S REMARKS

Chancellor Charles L. Isbell, Jr., addressed the Senate, thanking faculty for their ongoing work during a challenging period, and provided the following updates.

Administrative Reorganization: Updates to central administrative units effective January 1, 2026: (1) The Office of the Vice Chancellor for Administration and Operations merged into an expanded Office of the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration. (2) The Chief of Staff title updated to include Vice Chancellor for Administrative Strategy. (3) The Office of the Vice Chancellor for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion restructured and renamed the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Access, Civil Rights, and Community (ACRC), reflecting its ongoing mission. There are no changes to office responsibilities or campus unit operations.

Promotion and Tenure Updates: Candidates may submit an optional statement highlighting contributions to the University’s mission and values beyond research, teaching, or service. Changes apply to specialized faculty after January 1, 2026, and tenure-track faculty in the 2026–2027 cycle.

Hope Village: Approval is being sought from the Board of Trustees for a \$1M University contribution to a collaborative housing project addressing chronic homelessness in Champaign County called Hope Village. In addition to the \$1M from Carle Health and the \$1M from the University, \$10.3M has been received grant funding from various federal and state agencies. The project integrates health care access, trauma-informed design, and community-engaged research.

Support During Federal Government Shutdown: The University remains committed to supporting students, faculty, and staff, and will continue to offer resources to those affected by the shutdown or other hardship. Resources highlighted include assistance for

students in securing food on and around campus, the Everybody Eats program through University Housing, the Food Assistance and Wellbeing program available through Campus Recreation, and the LAS Undercover Food Pantry. These are in addition to off-campus food banks and programs available to all members of our community. Additionally, the Illinois Faculty-Staff Emergency Fund provides confidential, timely assistance to help faculty and staff during crises. And the University of Illinois Extension's response to increased demand for food assistance initiatives.

Student Support and Inclusion: The Chancellor emphasized ongoing support for undocumented students and collaborative campus efforts through the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Access, Civil Rights, and Community (ACRC), the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs (OVCSA), and International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS).

9. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

Chancellor Isbell responded to a question about the unfilled position of liaison to tribal communities. The role's status is under review as part of the ongoing reorganization, with discussions underway about how best to maintain and strengthen the University's commitments in this area. He noted broader plans to enhance relationships with tribal and other community partners, with updates expected in the spring.

John Coleman, Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, responded to a question about the Title VI Task Force stating that invitations to serve were sent out last week, with the charge letter to follow once responses are received. The Task Force is expected to begin work in the next couple of weeks, and the announcement will be shared via email. Student representation on the Task Force is still under consideration.
