MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:11 pm by Angela Lyons, Chair of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), with Professor Emeritus William J. Maher serving as Parliamentarian.

2. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

Remote participation was approved by unanimous consent.

3. APPROVAL OF A MEETING CHAIR *PRO TEMPORE*

SEC Chair Lyons informed the Senate that Rurik Tywoniw is ineligible to serve as Presiding Officer of the Senate under the Senate *Constitution* because he is not a member of a Senate electorate. Lyons acknowledged the unexpected nature of the situation and thanked Tywoniw for his service.

Available members of the SEC and the parliamentarians met in a special meeting to discuss the matter. Because neither the Senate *Constitution* nor the *Bylaws* address this circumstance, *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* (12th ed.) was consulted. The SEC recommended the Senate designate a chair *pro tempore* to assist with conducting the April 6, 2026 Senate meeting and will revisit the issue at its April 20, 2026 meeting.

Faculty senator Forsyth (ENGR) nominated H. George Friedman, Jr. to serve as chair *pro tempore*. Hearing no additional nominations, nominations were closed.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, Friedman was designated chair *pro tempore* for the April 6, 2026 Senate meeting, with 107 in favor, 5 opposed, and 9 abstentions.

6. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

Faculty senator and Chair of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), Angela Lyons (ACES) shared several updates. She reported that the faculty nominations for the presidential search committee have been forwarded to the Board of Trustees. Lyons also announced an upcoming forum, *Navigating AI Together: Conversations on Teaching, Research, and Responsibility*, co-sponsored by the Office of the Provost and the Senate, to be held April 15, 2026 and encouraged participation.

Lyons shared that the Ninth Senate Review Commission (SR9) has begun discussing its approach for reviewing the Senate and the remainder of its committees and will soon distribute a campuswide survey regarding the Senate and its committees. She also reminded senators that nominations and self-nominations for Senate committees, advisory bodies, and several Senate leadership positions are due April 11, 2026 at noon and encouraged broad participation from faculty across all units.

Lyons noted her recent participation in the David Dodds Henry Lecture and Symposium. She also thanked the chairs and members of the Senate Committee on General University Policy (GP) and the Committee on Academic Freedom and Tenure (AF) for their work on policy and governance matters. GP Chair Joanne Kaczmarek and AF Chair David Forsyth recently shared highlights from their committees' work this academic year with the SEC.

Senators raised concerns about the process and communication surrounding the designation of a chair *pro tempore* following the determination that the Presiding Officer of the Senate was ineligible. One senator noted the limited advance notice and difficulty of identifying a replacement under time constraints. SEC Chair Lyons and Clerk Roether explained that the eligibility issue emerged shortly before the meeting after it was determined that the Presiding Officer of the Senate did not meet the eligibility requirements of at least a half-time faculty appointment. Due to the compressed timeline, SEC convened on short notice and recommended a chair *pro tempore* be designated for the April 6 meeting only, with further discussion scheduled for the April 20, 2026 SEC meeting. Roether added that the Senate Committee on Committees (CC) plans to send a call for nominations for a Presiding Officer for the remaining Senate meetings on April 27 and May 4, 2026.

Concerns were also raised about email communications summarizing Senate business that have been forwarded through deans and unit leaders, whether they are approved through SEC, and what processes govern communications that include interpretive commentary on Senate agenda items. Chair Lyons explained these communications were intended to increase transparency and participation by providing brief summaries to units to increase awareness of Senate business and encourage broader participation.

A question was asked about the decision-making process for Senate co-sponsorship of the April 15, 2026 "Navigating AI Together" event, noting concerns about speaker representation and diversity, and requesting clarification on how Senate sponsorship decisions are made and who is involved in deliberation. Chair Lyons responded that the event was organized under significant time constraints, which limited speaker availability, and that the goal was to maintain momentum from prior campus collaborations. She noted the event format will be interactive rather than lecture-based and emphasized its intent to foster dialogue. Lyons acknowledged the need for clearer processes regarding Senate co-sponsorship and suggested that a committee may be needed to develop formal procedures for future events.

7. PROPOSALS

a) CC.26.30, Faculty Nominations to the 2026-2027 Athletic Board

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), committee member Bernhard Scully presented and moved approval of the slate of faculty nominees listed in CC.26.30 and

approval of Kaitlin Clark to continue serving as Academic Progress and Eligibility Committee (APEC) Chair.

Chair *pro tempore* Friedman called for nominations from the floor. Hearing no additional nominations, nominations were closed.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, the motion to adopt the slate of faculty nominees listed in CC.26.30 and approve Clark to continue as the APEC Chair was approved, with 168 in favor, 0 opposed, and 10 abstentions. The slate will be forward to the Chancellor for selection.

b) CC.26.31, Student Nominations to the 2026-2027 Athletic Board

On behalf of CC, committee member Bernhard Scully presented and moved approval of the slate of student nominees listed in CC.26.31.

Chair *pro tempore* Friedman called for nominations from the floor. Hearing no additional nominations, nominations were closed.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, the motion to adopt the slate of student nominees listed in CC.26.31 was approved, with 167 in favor, 1 opposed, and 9 abstentions. The slate will be forward to the Chancellor for selection.

c) Revisions to the *Student Code*

- **EP.26.099, Revise Section 3-509(b) in the *Student Code* (Students in Debt to the University)**
- **EP.26.119, Revise Section 3-508(c) in the *Student Code* (Refund Policy due to Military Leave)**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP), Chair Nolan Miller introduced minor revisions to the *Student Code* included in EP.26.099 and EP.26.119. There were no objections to considering the items as one motion and Chair Miller moved approval of EP.26.099 and EP.26.119 as one motion.

He noted that EP.26.099 revises Section 3-509 of the *Student Code* regarding students in debt to the University to reflect current practice, removing language about withholding diplomas and official transcripts and making minor updates related to returned checks.

EP.26.119 revises Section 3-508C on refunds for students who depart for U.S. military or other national defense service. Because students may now remain enrolled in some courses

remotely, the revision allows for partial refunds when students reduce their course load rather than fully withdraw.

Both items are technical updates aligning the *Student Code* with current policy and practice. Updates were reviewed and approved by the Senate Council on Student Conduct Expectations and Accountability (SA) and the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP) before being forwarded to the Senate.

In response to questions, it was noted that cash payments are not accepted. It was also clarified that the returned-check penalty amount is set and publicized by the University Bursar, and the specific dollar amount was removed from the *Student Code* to avoid requiring future amendments if the fee changes.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, the motion to adopt both EP.26.099 and EP.26.119 was approved, with 177 in favor, 0 opposed, and 4 abstentions.

d) EP.26.146, Establish the Department of Agricultural Leadership, Education, and Communications in the College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences

On behalf of EP, Chair Nolan Miller introduced and moved approval of EP.26.146. Chair Miller noted that EP.26.146 establishes the Department of Agricultural Leadership, Education, and Communications (ALEC) in the College of ACES, formalizing an existing interdisciplinary unit created in 2017. The change follows an external review recommending departmental status to align governance with current operations and does not create new programs or require additional resources. The proposal received stakeholder consultation, minimal feedback at a public hearing, approval by ACES faculty, and unanimous recommendation from EP. Faculty senator Yannarell (ACES) spoke in support, noting the benefits of departmental status for faculty equity and tenure alignment.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, the motion to adopt EP.26.146 was approved, with 172 in favor, 2 opposed, and 7 abstentions.

e) SP.25.05, Proposed Revision to the Statutes, Article XIII, Section 8 – Amendments

On behalf of the Senate Committee on University Statutes & Senate Procedures Chair Shawn Gilmore introduced and moved approval of SP.25.05 for a third reading and potential vote. Chair Gilmore noted that this amendment reorganizes and clarifies how changes to the *Statutes* are initiated, transmitted, and reconciled across the senates and the University Senates Conference (USC), while maintaining current authority structures. He reviewed the amendment pathways (senate, Board, president, or USC) and explained the

role of USC in reconciling differences among universities before transmission to the President and Board of Trustees. Gilmore noted that the proposal primarily restructures existing language to improve clarity about process and documentation without changing substantive authority. In response to prior Senate feedback, a revision was made to clarify provisions related to Board-initiated amendments, preserving the status quo while improving readability.

By a show of hands and Poll Everywhere vote, the motion to adopt SP.25.05 was approved, with 166 in favor, 0 opposed, and 16 abstentions.

f) SP.26.02, Proposed Revision to the *Statutes*, Article II, Sections 3a(1) and 3a(2) – Faculty Role in Governance (ST-91)

On behalf of SP, Chair Gilmore introduced SP.26.02 for a third reading. Gilmore noted that this proposed amendment to the *Statutes* has been under review throughout the year and discussed by relevant Senate committees. The proposal expands the definition of faculty included in the section “Faculty Role in Governance” to include additional non-tenure-track categories and clarifies provisions related to tenure-related voting and voting on appointments and promotions. SP is developing a response for a future Senate vote and noted several discussion points, including alignment with Urbana faculty categories, potential impacts on existing unit bylaws, and the appropriateness of including appointment and promotion voting provisions in this section of the *Statutes*. A revised version will be brought forward for consideration at a future meeting.

No vote was conducted.

8. PUBLIC COMMENT

No requests received.

9. CHANCELLOR’S REMARKS

Chancellor Charles L. Isbell, Jr. highlighted recent athletic achievements, including the men’s basketball team’s Final Four appearance, the women’s basketball team’s NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) tournament win, and strong seasons for both men’s and women’s wheelchair basketball teams, each finishing third in their respective national tournaments. He also noted record-setting attendance for women’s basketball and emphasized the broader institutional impact of athletics on recruitment, philanthropy, public engagement, and campus morale, as well as the importance of coordinated public safety planning during tournament celebrations.

He presented key findings from the Illini Success Report, showing that 93% of graduates secured employment or continued education within six months of graduation, with strong in-state retention and the University remaining the top destination for graduate and professional study among its graduates. He emphasized the high rate of student participation in experiential learning and its strong link to job placement, underscoring the importance of demonstrating the value of higher education to the public and policymakers.

In federal updates, the Chancellor reported ongoing institutional engagement in legal and policy matters, including support for litigation related to U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) funding conditions and state-level challenges to changes in federal Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) reporting requirements. He also noted favorable legal outcomes regarding federal indirect cost rate caps, while emphasizing continued monitoring of evolving federal policy and its potential impacts on the University.

10. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

On federal indirect cost rates (ICR), it was clarified that negotiated rates are based on standard federal cost-recovery processes and institutional accounting of actual expenditures and remain below full cost recovery. Recent legal outcomes were noted as favorable, but do not change the underlying negotiated structure.

Multiple senators raised concerns about a recent incident involving racist imagery on campus and broader issues related to Native American representation. The Interim Vice Chancellor for Access, Civil Rights, and Community, Gioconda (Gio) Guerra Pérez, confirmed that the University was promptly made aware of the banner, which was located on a private, certified building. The banner was removed the same day after direct engagement with fraternity leadership. The matter has been referred to the Title VI Office, which has initiated a formal review process. Additional discussion referenced ongoing campus work related to Native affairs, including a review of related portfolio functions and coordination among units supporting Indigenous students, research, and programs.

A question was raised regarding Senate co-sponsorship of the *Navigating AI Together: Conversations on Teaching, Research, and Responsibility* event and concerns about shared governance. SEC Chair Lyons acknowledged concerns about consultation and process, noting that the event was developed through prior communications and committee involvement, but agreed that the experience highlighted the need for a more formalized approval process for future Senate co-sponsored events. Lyons indicated this will be brought to SEC for development of clearer procedures.

In response to a procedural question, Clerk Roether confirmed that actions taken by the Senate remain valid regardless of the previously discussed eligibility issue regarding the Presiding Officer of the Senate, as actions of the Senate are actions of the body rather than the person presiding over the meeting.

A senator also raised concerns about delays in posting recordings of Senate meetings. Clerk Roether explained that posting is handled by another campus unit and is subject to processing requirements, including legally required closed captioning, which can affect turnaround time depending on the workload of that campus unit.

On broader geopolitical concerns, senators requested acknowledgment of ongoing international conflicts and their impacts on campus. The Chancellor and Interim Vice Chancellor described existing protocols for monitoring and supporting affected individuals, including travel registry checks, risk alerts, and targeted outreach to students and scholars potentially impacted by regional events. They emphasized that support is provided through direct, individualized contact rather than broad campus-wide messaging, consistent with established institutional practice. The Interim Vice Chancellor added that support services are also available through International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS), including expanded resources for individuals indirectly affected through family or residency ties.
