BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

We propose dropping the Master of Arts in the Teaching of German (MAT)

JUSTIFICATION:

The MAT degree has been dormant for some years now. We currently have neither students enrolled nor applicants. We would like to eliminate the graduate degree in the teaching of the language, thereby following the example of the other foreign languages departments on this campus.

To enable graduate students to become certified as teachers, the department plans to permit students to enroll in a certification program in the teaching of foreign languages, which is already in place.
