PROPOSAL TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATIONAL POLICY

Title of the proposed minor: Interdisciplinary Minor in the Study of the Islamic World

Sponsoring unit: Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies

Date: June 2005

Brief description of the program of study:

The Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies proposes the creation of an undergraduate minor in the Study of the Islamic World. This is part of a larger project to strengthen the study of the Islamic world at the University of Illinois, which is being funded by the Department of Education's Undergraduate International Studies and Foreign Language Program during AY 2004-06. Other elements of the program have included the seeding of two new positions in Arabic literature and theory and culture, and the creation of a new general education course "Introduction to the World of Islam," which was taught in SP 05.

This interdisciplinary minor is designed for students interested in developing an expertise in one or more parts of the Islamic World or in Islamic culture generally, as a complement to their disciplinary major. There is no major in this subject area and none is planned. Students will acquire depth of knowledge in an Islamic culture by completing a fourth semester of one of the approved languages of the Islamic world and by taking at least six hours of 300- and 400- level courses. The Study of the Islamic World minor is not disciplinary but interdisciplinary. A comprehensive approach is insured by the requirement of one of three introductory courses: Intro to the World of Islam, History of the Islamic Middle East, or Introduction to Islam.

Requirements:

The minor will require 20 hours of course work:

- 5 hours representing completion of a fourth semester course in one of several Islamic world languages: Arabic, Turkish, Swahili or Wolof.
- 3 hours representing one of the following General Education courses: SAME 133 Intro to the World of Islam, HIST 135 History of the Islamic Middle East, or RLST 213/214 Introduction to Islam.
- 12 hours of courses chosen from an approved list of 200- to 400- level courses, 6 hours of which must be at the 300 or 400 level. The courses must come from at least two disciplines.

Prerequisites for the minor and expected enrollment in the minor: There are no prerequisites and there is no limit on the number of minors. We expect the number of students to reach 50, with proper advertising.

Admission to the minor: The Director of the Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies will monitor admission to the minor.

Minor advisor: The Director of the Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies will act as advisor to the students enrolled in it. Students will declare their intent to complete the minor requirements in Student Academic Affairs of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences or the equivalent if they are in a different college.

Certification of successful completion: Since this is an interdisciplinary minor, certification of successful completion of it will be done by the advisor, namely the Director of the Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies.

An interdisciplinary minor in the Study of the Islamic World is offered by the Program in South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies. It is designed for students interested in developing an expertise in one or more parts of the Islamic world or in Islamic culture generally, as a complement to their disciplinary major. Completion of the minor requires 20 credit hours in applicable courses with a minimum grade-point average of 2.75.
